SUMMARY REPORT

According to Article VIII (b), Ordinary Congress shall be convened every four years. Article VIII (c) states that the Congress shall be convened to consider and decide on the following – (i) Reports on activities of the Regional Organisation, including financial reports; (ii) General trade union policy questions and resolutions; (iii) General questions of interest to working people which call for policy to be formulated to guide the Regional Organisation and member organisations; (iv) Proposals for the activity of the Regional Organisation during the period to follow; (v) Proposals for amendments to the Constitution; (vi) Any other proposal submitted by member organisations; (vii) Nominations for the election of the General Council, the General Secretary and the Internal Auditors; (viii) Ratify applications for affiliation; (ix) ratify sanctions.

In fulfillment of these constitutional provisions, ITUC-Africa convened its 5th Ordinary Congress on 28-30 November 2023 at the Safari Park Hotel in Nairobi, Kenya.

203 numbers of delegates were registered by the affiliates. As of the time of preparing this report, 75 affiliates have presented complete credentials and partook in the activities of the congress, including contributing to debates, moving motions, and voting.

We had 12 affiliates with partial credentials who participated in the activities of Congress, but would not vote in line with our rules (Article XI (e).

Analysis of the delegates' registration shows that 40% (39.83) are women, 60% (60.17) are men, and 10.8% are youth.

We also have 172 observers and guests that registered and attended the Congress.

The opening ceremony was also the opportunity to give awards to past trade union leaders and individuals who contributed to the growth and development of ITUC-Africa.

During this ceremony, **Brother François Adjia Djondang**, former Secretary General of UST/Chad and Member of the ITUC-Africa General Council, was honoured posthumously.

On day two, the General Secretary of ITUC-Africa, Com. Kwasi ADU-AMANKWAH presented the congress statement "Amka Afrika!" which provoked healthy and exciting reactions from participants, notably Prof P. L. O. Lumumba, who, among other charged and challenged the African trade unions to deepen their engagement and utilisation of social dialogue to resolve conflicts and wars on the continent (Sudan, Niger, Mali etc.) He also challenged trade unions to organise better to fight for recovering welfare for people. The Congress document is available in our official working languages on the ITUC-Africa website. Hopefully, this document will serve as a reference document, at least for the next quadrennial.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

The Secretariat has proposed for the attention of the congress delegates the following list of constitutional amendments which were adopted:

RESOLUTIONS

Thirteen (13) resolutions were debated and adopted:

- 1. Defending and Promoting Democracy and Human Rights.
- 2. Migration governance and Africa's integration agenda.
- 3. Resolution on social protection addressing the expansion, coverage and financing challenges.
- 4. Contributing to the dismantling of debt bondage.
- 5. Resolution on Digitalization and Digital Rights in Africa.
- 6. Occupational Safety and Health
- 7. Equality
- 8. Trade, Africa's industrialization and economic transformation
- 9. Resolution on Unionization Organising
- 10. Youth inclusion in trade unions into the Trade Union Movement in Africa
- 11. Youth employment and employability
- 12. Working-class solidarity
- 13. Resolution on green jobs, just transition and climate action.

The thirteen resolutions were divided and assigned to the six commissions created by Congress to discuss and report their positions on the resolutions to the plenary of Congress. The various Commissions made inspiring reports based on the robust debates they had and called on Congress to adopt the resolutions. All the resolutions were adopted with the necessary suggested amendments. Notably, the Commission that discussed the resolutions on Human and Labour Rights, Democracy, Migration, Peace and Security highlighted the need for ITUC-Africa to remain seized with the issue of the humanitarian crisis that the Israeli-Hamas war is causing to the Palestinian people and communities. It was also agreed that our organisation would continue to denounce the humanitarian situation and pursue genuine efforts to contribute to attaining the two-state solution.
